STARVING PROSTATE CANCER CELLS

Associate Professor Jeff Holst has discovered an important nutrient that is vital for helping prostate cancer cells grow. Jeff's findings indicate that prostate cancer cells are unable to grow if the key nutrient pumps are blocked. These new findings bring us one step closer to finding a new treatment for prostate cancer.



GENETIC LINK IN ALCOHOLIC CIRRHOSIS

Centenary is leading the world's first genome-wide association study in alcoholic cirrhosis. This month we released some of the initial clinical findings to emerge from the study, which suggest a possible genetic link in alcoholic cirrhosis. Leading the study is Dr Devanshi Seth, who is striving towards improved diagnosis and treatment of the condition.



UNDERSTANDING YOUNG STROKE

Innovative new research led by Dr Xiangjian Zheng, has uncovered a new molecular connection between the loss of activity in Cerebral Cavernous Malformations (CCM) genes and weakened blood vessels in the brain; a major cause of stroke in young people. This is an important finding as presently there is no non-surgical treatment for this cause of stroke.

The number of cases of cancer diagnosed in Australia is projected to rise over the next decade for both males and females and is expected to reach about 150,000 in 2020.



Cancer is one of the fastest growing diseases. Cancer incidence will increase by 40% between 2007 and 2020.



From 2001-02 to 2012-13 the number of cancer related hospitalisations in Australia increased by 41% from 649,353 to 914,993.



1 in 2 Australian men and 1 in 3 Australian women will be diagnosed with cancer by the age of 85.
